Pastor Doug's Letter

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year,

This newsletter is arriving in the midst of the 12 days of Christmas. The commercial Christmas ended on Christmas Eve and the faith festival began on Christmas Day. It lasts until the coming of the magi on January 6. Now that the shouts of "buy this" and "give this" have faded away, we can turn to discover Jesus in the out of way places he loves to inhabit.

The world loves glitter and glamor, the ever larger and more extravagant. God's grandeur comes in the work of creation. God's extravagance is found in purple mountain's majesty, the thunder of Niagara Falls, and the billions of glittering stars. Did you know that there are 5,000 species of ladybugs around the world? 


Jan. 3 & 4 **Jesus Says Come and See** Second Sunday of Christmas Communion

Devotional: Pastor Doug led council in devotional on Luke 17:11-19 and a prayer.

Nelson Golden called the meeting to order at 6:15 PM. The Church Council read the **Motto**, **Mission** & **Vision Statements** in unison.

The October 16, 2025, Council Minutes were approved unanimously. Mark Swaney moved and Amanda Schmerge seconded.

Financial Report: Council reviewed the Treasurer's report. In October, income was at \$20,400.71 with expenses at \$23,728.72. Year to date income is \$214,404.84 with expenses at \$217,084.88. Laura Heitz moved to accept the report, Pastor Doug seconded; motion carried.

The **Social Ministry Committee** report was given by Karen Lenhart. The committee will be meeting on January 6, 2026 and plans are in the works for a chili cook-off on January 25th.

Marguerite Wallen gave the **Property Committee Report**. The bathroom project has been completed. A tree will be removed from the property on September 20th at 10:00am. Maintenance on brick work near the main entrance will be scheduled for this fall.

In **new business**, Laura Heitz, JP Metz and Karen Lenhart will be completing their term with church council. Jen Garber and Richard Ault are willing to serve on council. **The Annual Meeting** to approve the 2026 Budget and to vote on council members will be Sunday December 7 at 11:15, immediately following the worship service. Members are encouraged to attend the meeting to ensure that a quorum is met.

Pastor Carol Pretorius painted an image of Jesus that has been donated to St. Mark's. Pastor Doug has donated six glass oil lamps that can be used for All Saint's Day or to decorate the church. Council thanks both of them for their generous donations.
