The Pastor's Letter

Friends,

Yesterday, I was asked how I did on my Lenten disciplines. Well, the first was to follow the NOOM eating guide. That was a fail. The second was to read daily from a devotional called *The Little Book*. Yes, I did, but there were a few times I had to "catch up." The third and main discipline was to engage in practicing the weekly "to do" challenges. That proved interesting and transformative.

Each week in Lent, I took one of the commands of Jesus and invited us all to do that command. There were a variety of suggestions as idea starters. For instance, the first week was the story when Jesus commanded an inquiring man, "Go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." Although I invited folks to consider selling something and giving the money to the poor, to my knowledge no one sold any thing. People gave. Generously. But didn't sell. What does that say about our culture's obsessive and locked-tight attachment to stuff?

I was most challenged by Jesus' command, "Give to Caesar the things that are Caesar's and to God the things that are God's." As I wrestled with what is owed the government and what is owed God, I decided to obey all traffic laws—such as doing no more than 25 in a 25-mph speed zone and letting the truck rock back to a full stop at a stop sign. My immense difficulty in doing this made me realize my arrogance. I believed that I drove better than others. I believed that such laws were suggestions, not rules. I also began to notice that I had such arrogance around Jesus' "spiritual commandments"—such as, "give to everyone who begs from you" and "do not judge" and "Beware of the scribes *(that is, pastors)*, who like to walk around in long robes and to be greeted with respect in the marketplaces and to have the best seats in the synagogues *(churches)* and places of honor at banquets!" Ouch!

What was your Lenten discipline? How did it change you? What did it teach you about God?

I found it interesting that not one person challenged me, "Why are you asking us to **do** all these things? I thought Lutherans emphasized that the doing of good works leads to self-righteousness and leads away from trust in God. I thought we emphasized it all comes by grace, as a gift, and not by works?"

I once had a therapist tell me, "Don't feel your way into acting better, act your way into feeling better. If you change your behavior, you change your mind, and thus change your feelings." I had always thought the opposite, good feelings led to good behavior.

Not only does changing our behavior change us, it also changes our relationships, even our relationship with God. For example, when I started slowing down to 25, I began asking, "What is the rush? What compels me to do more in a day? Is God demanding more of me than I have time to do? Does not God have all the time there is?" The **behavior** of slowing down my speed caused me to **change my mind** about God's expectations of me which caused me to **feel** peaceful, less rushed, more connected.

Insurance Carrier Changes, New Policy to Prevent Child Abuse

St. Mark's current insurance carrier is opting out of insuring churches starting May 1. So, St. Mark's is in the process of obtaining a new insurance carrier. However, to have a sexual misconduct rider the new carrier requires St. Mark's to have a *Policy to Prevent Abuse Against Children and Youth*. Therefore, the church council assigned a task force to develop the policy. Using the model recommended by the ELCA, the task force has a preliminary policy that puts into words the practices that we already follow. More information will be forthcoming after the church council adopts it on April 18. Our insurance will continue uninterrupted.

St. Mark's Lutheran Church Council March 21, 2024, Meeting Minutes

Laura Heitz called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM.

Members Present: Laura Heitz, Mark Swaney, Pastor Doug, Mike Burton, JP Metz, Shelley Koch, and Dustin Jeanneret. Pastor Doug opened the meeting with a prayer.

Council Meeting Minutes: The minutes were emailed to all the members. JP Metz made a motion to approve the minutes, Mike Burton seconded; motion carried.

Financial Report:

- Mike Burton presented the finance committee report. There is approximately 100K in our checking that is not reserved for a dedicated account.
- YTD total income is 2.62% below budget. We will be opening a savings account with Minster bank to allow for PayPal and Venmo online donations.
- The Finance committee made a recommendation to pay back 50K on principal and interest against the renovation loans. As of April 1, we would owe a little over 80K in principle and we still have 68K in pledges. JP Metz made the motion to approve, Shelley Knoch seconded, motion carried.
- Paul Rogers has been cleaning up accounts payable as we are behind in liabilities. He discovered that we have money sitting as designated but really is not and has been sitting as such for a number of years, \$9,268.24 total which was labeled as liability. After much discussion, Finance Committee recommends: Moving \$584.58 from Account 017-61-10-53 into Account 017-61-10-17 Wernle Childrens Home, and the remaining balance to Account 017-61-10-05 Capital Improvement. Mark Swaney made a motion to accept the finance committee's transfer recommendations, Mike Burton seconded; motion carried.

Pastor's Report:

- Pastor Doug made a motion that Linda Link be approved to join St. Mark's by Affirmation of Faith, that Sandy Davis be transferred to St. Mark's from St. John's Lutheran Church in Sidney, and that Greg & Maria Koerner, their daughter Carissa (Mines) Koerner, and Nancy Ainsworth be transferred to St. Mark's from First English Lutheran Church, Wapakoneta. JP Metz seconded; motion carried.
- Pastor Doug made a motion that Evelyn "Evie" Eileen Oen be baptized and receive her First Communion. Dustin Jeanneret seconded; motion carried.
- The following church members have died this year: David Micheal Helmlinger on January 28, 2024. Georgia Anna Fox on February 12, 2024, and Judith "Judy," Ann Winter on February 23, 2024.
- Lisa Barfield resigned; her final day was March 14.
- St. Marks hired Elaine Hawkins as our Administrative Assistant, starting April 1, 2024.

- The eclipse glasses that were purchased are defective and the company is replacing them.
- Pastor Doug held Homebound Communion training on March 13, and a rotation has been set up.
- Pastor Doug ordered a second safe so that we can store blank checks.

Property & Maintenance Committee:

- JP Metz reminded us that Dotson Plumbing has agreed to replace the galvanized pipe in the furnace room on Maundy Thursday, March 28th.
- Snow removal contract adjustments were discussed regarding the surface area to be plowed and the frequency.

Old Business:

- Parking signs on the eclipse were discussed.
- Additional discussion ensued regarding the implementation of Worship Family (from the work of the Strategic Planning Committee.)

New Business:

• Our insurance provider is no longer serving churches so Chris Sorensen has found a new provider and will be presenting the policy to the church council on April 18. The new insurance company requires the church to have a sexual misconduct policy in order to have coverage for sexual misconduct liabilities. The church council appointed Laura Heitz, Shelley Koch, Chris Sorensen and Pastor Doug to an action committee to create St. Mark's Sexual Misconduct Policy and Procedures.

The next meeting will be on April 18, 2024 @ 7PM. The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer. Cordially submitted,


