Pastor Doug's Letter

Beloved Friends,

In this month in which we celebrate Thanksgiving, I offer this to you for your reflection and for use around your thanksgiving table. It is called a *Litany of Thanksgiving*, and it is from *Meditations of the Heart* by Howard Thurman, pages 147-149.

Today, I make my Sacrament of Thanksgiving.

I begin with the simple things of my days:

Fresh air to breathe,

Cool water to drink,

The taste of food,

The protection of houses and clothes,

The comforts of home.

For all these I make an act of Thanksgiving this day!

I bring to mind all the warmth of humankind that I have known:

My mother's arms,

The strength of my father,

The playmates of my childhood,

The wonderful stories brought to me from the lives of many who talked of days gone by when fairies and giants and all kinds of magic held sway;

The tears I have shed, the tears I have seen;

The excitement of laughter and the twinkle in the eye with its reminder that life is good.

For all these I make an act of Thanksgiving this day.

I finger one by one the messages of hope that awaited me at the crossroads:

The smile of approval from those who held in their hands the reins of my security;

The tightening of the grip in a single handshake when I feared the step before me in the darkness;

The whisper in my heart when the temptation was fiercest and the claims of appetite were not to be denied;

The crucial word said, the simple sentence from an open page when my decision hung in the balance.

For all these I make an act of Thanksgiving this day.

I pass before me the mainsprings of my heritage:

The fruits of the labors of countless generations who lived before me, without whom my own life would have no meaning;

The seers who saw visions and dreamed dreams;

The prophets who sensed a truth greater than the mind could grasp and whose words could only find fulfillment in the years which they would never see;

The workers whose sweat has watered the trees, the leaves of which are for the healing of the nations;

The pilgrims who set their sails for lands beyond all horizons, whose courage made paths into new worlds and far-off places;

The saviors whose blood was shed with a recklessness that only a dream could inspire and God could command.

For all this I make an act of Thanksgiving this day.

I linger over the meaning of my own life and the commitment to which I give the loyalty of my heart and mind:

The little purposes in which I have shared with my loves, my desires, my gifts;

The restlessness which bottoms all I do with its stark insistence that I have never done my best, I have never reached for the highest;

The big hope that never quite deserts me, that I and my kind will study war no more, that love and tenderness and all the inner graces of Almighty affection will cover the life of the children of God as the waters cover the sea.

All these and more than mind can think and heart can feel, I make as my sacrament of Thanksgiving to Thee, Our Father, in humbleness of mind and simplicity of heart.


Mission Wapak Helps Homeless Woman

Our Scripture story today is the Elijah's encounter with God on the mountain top after he flees for his life in despair that God's will and work will ever take place.

Until that day comes, however, we are to live as if it is already present, for the extent to which the Christ Child is born in us is the extent to which the vision is a reality here and now.

The Israelites have been forcibly taken into Exile, but Jeremiah's word to them from the Lord is not to seek to return to their homeland. Instead they are to:

- 1. Settle in, make a life there, and seek the welfare of the place where they find themselves,
- 2. Have hope for your future, short-term and long-term.
- 3. Call upon God, come to God, pray to God, and search for God with all their heart. Only when they have done all of this will they be returned to their land.

Nov. 29 & 30 **Daniel: The Furnace of Blazing Fire** First Sunday of Advent Daniel 3:1-30 Psalm 31:1-8 John 18:36-37 **Speaking Truth to Power**

Advent begins today. These four weeks before Christmas are designed to be a season to do some spiritual housecleaning. Just like most of us spend time cleaning and decorating our homes for Christmas, there is a necessity of doing so spiritually. Old unfruitful habits and foolish ways of thinking need discarded. One area for spiritual examination is our relationship to power.

Nelson Golden called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM and led council in devotional on Matt. 6:19-24.

The Church Council read the Motto, Mission & Vision Statements in unison.

The September 11, 2025, Council Minutes were approved unanimously. Laura Heitz moved and JP Metz seconded.

Financial Report: JP Metz presented the Treasurer's report. Income for the month of September was \$18,949.71 with expenses at \$25,241.39. Our year to date income is \$194,004.13 with expenses at \$193,356.00 for a year to date net income of \$648.13. Nelson Golden moved to accept the report and Laura Heitz seconded; motion carried.

Paul Rogers joined the meeting to present the 2026 Budget to council. Adjustments to the budget have been proposed to accommodate the new guidelines recommended to the synod regarding the compensation of Pastors. JP Metz made a motion to present the prospective budget to the congregation on Sunday, December 7th. The motion was seconded by Amanda Schmerge and carried.

The **Social Ministry Committee** report was given by Karen Lenhart. The group will met on September 23rd and made plans for a soup carry in on October 26th following Youth Sunday worship. The group has started sending birthday cards to members and will be planning a chili cook-off in January. After many years of service, Laura Heitz will be stepping down and the coordinator of Loaves and Fishes. Members are asked to consider serving in this role. The committee will meet again on January 6th at 5:30pm.

Marguerite Wallen gave the **Property Committee Report**. A tree was removed from the property on September 20th. Maintenance work will be completed on the boilers to fix an improper ph reading.
